MINUTES
July 5, 2006
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The Bossier Parish Police Jury met in regular and legal session on this 5th day of July, 2006, at 2:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Bossier Parish Courthouse, Benton, Louisiana. The President, Mr. Jerome Darby, called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Mr. Eddy Shell and the pledge of allegiance was led by Mr. Hank Meachum. The Secretary-Treasurer, Ms. Cheryl Martin, called the roll, with all members present, as follows:

Others present were Mr. Bill Altimus, Parish Administrator; Mr. Patrick Jackson, Parish Attorney, Mr. Joe E. "Butch" Ford, Jr., Parish Engineer; Ms. Cheryl Martin, Secretary-Treasurer.

Ms. Cheryl Chandler, Bossier Parish EMS District, was present for discussion of the request of the EMS District for an increase in fees for medical transport of prisoners. Mr. Hammack requested that members of the Board of Commissioners for Bossier Parish EMS be asked to address the jury regarding this matter. Ms. Chandler stated that she will advise board members of this request. **Motion was made by Mr. Altimus, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to invite members of the Board of Commissioners for the Bossier Parish EMS District to attend the July 19, 2006 regular meeting to discuss the requested fee increase. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Ray Stanfill, 109 Pine Lake Drive, discussed the Children's Counseling Center, advising that this is a 501(c)3 charity organization which provides preventive oriented, outpatient mental health services to children and families by offering individual, family and group counseling. Mr. Stanfill stated that the services are offered primarily to low-income families and requested that the police jury consider providing assistance to the program.

Mr. Jess McEntee and Ms. Linda McEntee were present. Mr. McEntee stated that he currently serves as director for the center, and advised that the program caters to helping any child with emotional and behavioral problems with fees based on their ability to pay.

After discussion, **motion was made by Mr. Cummings, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to refer this matter to the Juvenile Committee for review. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Carson Lyons and Ms. Sheila Lyons addressed the jury regarding problems in obtaining access to their home at 1756 Sligo Road. Ms. Lyons stated that they are involved in litigation with the previous owner as he will not allow them access via a private road located on his property. Mr. Jackson, Parish Attorney, stated that because this is a private road, the police jury has no jurisdiction in this matter. He requested that he be allowed time to review all legal documents and report his findings at a later date.

Motion was made by Mr. Altimus, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to adopt an ordinance levying the 2006 property tax millage rates for the General Alimony Tax, Highway Tax, Library Tax, Health Unit Tax and Corrections Facilities Tax. Motion carried unanimously.

Emergency Medical Services District for the year 2006. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCE NO. 4107

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF A USER FEE OF \$36.00 PER YEAR (MILL KEY #1026053) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COSTS OF ANY AND ALL EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION AND ALL EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE BOSSIER PARISH EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE DISTRICT, PARISH OF BOSSIER, STATE OF LOUISIANA, FOR THE YEAR 2006, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAW.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury, acting as the governing authority of the Bossier Parish Emergency Medical Service District, in regular and legal session on the 5th day of July, 2006, that in accordance with law, a user fee of \$36.00 per year for the year 2006, shall be assessed persons owning each residential or commercial structure either occupied or unoccupied, located wholly or partly within the boundaries of the said District, each residential or commercial structure being defined as each residential or commercial unit in a structure and each housing unit within a multiple structure, and a mobile home, as defined in R. S. 9:1149.s(3), for the purpose of paying the costs of any and all emergency medical transportation and all emergency services incidental thereto, as authorized and approved at a special election held in said District on October 16, 1993.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the proper administrative officers of the Parish of Bossier, State of Louisiana, be and they are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to extend said user fee against assessment roll of said District for the year 2006, and to make the collection of the user fee imposed for and on behalf of said District, according to law, and that the user fee herein levied shall become a permanent lien and privilege on all property subject to said user fee as set forth by law, and the collection shall be enforceable in the manner provided by law.

Motion was made by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to levy an acreage tax of eight cents per acre on all forest lands and cut-over potential forest lands situated in Bossier Parish, LA, for the year 2006. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDINANCE NO. 4108

AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY AN ACREAGE TAX (MILL KEY #1026043) OF EIGHT CENTS PER ACRE ON ALL FOREST LANDS AND CUT-OVER POTENTIAL FOREST LANDS, SITUATED IN BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, AND TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE ASSESSOR IN AND FOR BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, TO ASSESS AND EXTEND SAID TAX ON THE TAX ROLL, AND TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT TAX TO BE COLLECTED BY THE SHERIFF AND EX-OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR IN AND FOR BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, AND AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF SAID FUNDS COLLECTED, ALL ACCORDING TO LAW.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Bossier Parish in regular and legal session on the 5th day of July, 2006, that for the year 2006 there shall be levied on acreage a tax of eight cents per acre on all forest lands and cut-over potential forest lands situated in Bossier Parish, Louisiana.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that this acreage tax shall be assessed and extended on the tax roll of Bossier Parish, Louisiana, by the Parish Assessor in the same manner as the assessment and extension on the tax rolls of the other taxes.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that said acreage tax shall be collected by the Sheriff and Ex-Officio Tax Collector of Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in the same manner as other parish taxes and when so collected shall be remitted to the Department of the Government having jurisdiction over the practice of forestry for deposit into the State Forestry Fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that said acreage tax shall be collected and deposited all in accordance with the law.

Sealed bids were opened and read aloud for the sale of surplus property located at 2662 Trichel, described as the Northwesterly 59.19 feet of Lot 1, Blk 18, Airport Annex, Bossier City, LA, as follows:

Ms. Martin advised that this is the only bid received. Minimum acceptable bid is \$3,543.48. **Motion was made by Mr. Hammack, seconded by Mr. Altimus, to accept the bid of Cody Investments, LLC, in the amount of \$5,001.01. Motion carried unanimously.**

Motion was made by Mr. Altimus, seconded by Mr. Hammack, to authorize the re-advertising for bids for the sale of surplus property located at Lot 56, Blk F. Second Resub of part of Macks Bayou Plantation, Bossier Parish, Louisiana; minimum acceptable bid \$2,600. Motion carried unanimously. Bids are to be received August 2, 2006.

Motion was made by Mr. Altimus, seconded by Mr. Williams, to declare adjudicated property located at the South 1/2 of the East 1/2 of Plot 2, Block E, Resub of Part of Macks Bayou Plantation as surplus, and authorize the advertising for bids for the sale of said property, bids to be received August 2, 2006; minimum bid \$2,753.36. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Marvin's Garden, located in Section 33, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA. Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that the property is located at the intersection of Wemple Road and Airline Drive and advised that a convenience store is planned for the property. He stated that the business will be served by Bossier City water and sewer.

Mr. Ford stated that the developer has provided an additional 10 feet of right-of-way for the proposed bike trail to Lakewood Subdivision. He further stated that the developer has agreed to participate with the police jury in the cost for construction of a southbound turn lane on Airline Drive west to Wemple Road.

There being no opposition, **motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Marvin's Garden, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.**

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Sterling Ranch Estates, Unit No. 3, located in Section 4, Township 18 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, LA. Mr. Reggie Lewis, Raley & Associates was present, advising that there are a total of 43 lots proposed, advising that four lots will front along Bellevue Road. He stated that each of these lots will have an individual sewer treatment plant and advised that the remaining lots will be served by the existing sewer treatment system for other units of Sterling Ranch Estates. Mr. Lewis stated that the homes to be constructed on the four lots along Bellevue Road will have side-entry garages which will allow the resident to back out and go forward onto Bellevue Road. Mr. Avery stated that there should be no traffic backing out onto Bellevue Road. Mr. Jackson stated that the police jury can stipulate this requirement in its approval of the plat. Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that a 60' building set-back is needed on Bellevue Road, advising that this will allow ample room for the proposed reconstruction of Bellevue Road.

Mr. Mike Thornton stated that he owns property adjacent to the proposed development and requested that a construction entrance be required. He stated that this matter was discussed during MPC hearings on the development and the developer indicated that a construction entrance will be provided. Mr. Lewis stated that leaving one of the four lots on Bellevue Road empty for use as a construction entrance is being considered.

Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that a letter from Village Water System is needed, as well as a letter of approval from the health department regarding the sewer system. He stated that the development will have curb and gutter streets, with street lights and sidewalks. It was requested that a copy of the covenants for this development be submitted to Mr. Ford.

Motion was made by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Avery, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Sterling Ranch Estates, Unit No. 3, subject to receipt of the required approval letters and a copy of the covenants for this development. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Woollen Subdivision, Unit No. 1, located in Section 16, Township 18 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, LA. Mr. Jeff Raley, Raley & Associates, stated that a car wash is proposed on this property. There was discussion of the sewer system. Mr. Avery stated that due to the drainage of soapy water from the car wash, some type of filtration system may be needed. Mr. Ford recommended that the plat be approved subject to health department approval of the sewer system. There being no opposition, **motion was made by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Woollen Subdivision, Unit No. 1, subject to approval by the health department.**

Mr. Rogers discussed access from the car wash to Highway 80. Mr. Sam Marsiglia, Bossier City MPC, stated that there will be only one driveway to Highway 80 and advised that the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development has approved the proposal. **Votes were cast on Mr. Rogers' motion to approve the plat of Woollen Subdivision, Unit No. 1, subject to health department approval. Motion carried unanimously.**

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Rosedale Place Subdivision, Unit No. 9, located in Lots 3, 4 and 5 of Big Bee Bend Plantation, in Section 33, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA. Mr. Jeff Raley, Raley & Associates, was present. Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that the proposed development will be served by Bossier City water and sewer, and advised that sidewalks and street lights are planned.

Mr. Raley stated that all issues with a ditch in the subdivision have been resolved, advising that if lots are planned adjacent to the ditch, the developer will pave that portion of the ditch. He stated that this unit will not be affected. Mr. Raley stated that there will be no development at the ditch until all matters are resolved with the property owners. There being no opposition, **motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Cochran, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Rosedale Place Subdivision, Unit No. 9, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.**

Motion was made by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to schedule a public hearing on August 2, 2006, to consider the application of Mohr & Associates, Inc., for a zoning amendment to change the zoning classification of a tract of land located in Section 16, Township 18 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, LA, from R-A, Residential-Agriculture District and B-2, Limited Business District, to B-3, General Business District, for a retail pharmacy. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Mr. Mitchell, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to schedule a public hearing on August 2, 2006, to consider the application of Mohr & Associates, Inc., for a conditional use approval on a proposed B-3 tract, 994 Highway 80 East, Bossier Parish, LA, for the retail sale of low content packaged alcohol at a CVS Pharmacy, for off-premise consumption. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to schedule a public hearing on August 2, 2006, to consider the application of LP Development, LLC, for a zoning amendment to change the zoning classification of a tract of land located in Section 22, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA, from R-MD, Residential Medium Density District, to B-1, Commercial-Office Business District, for commercial offices. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to schedule a public hearing on August 2, 2006, to consider the application of LP Development, LLC, for a zoning amendment to change the zoning classification of a tract of land located in Section 21, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA, from R-MD, Residential Medium Density District, to B-2, Limited Business District, for commercial offices. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Meachum discussed of the purchase of additional courthouse property, advising that Judge Campbell has additional acreage adjacent to the courthouse that he has offered for sale for \$1.1 million. He stated that this is very valuable property with road frontage along Palmetto Road.

Mr. Jackson, Parish Attorney, stated that this property is very valuable to the police jury due to the location near the courthouse. The matter was referred to the Building and Grounds Committee for review.

Motion was made by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Cochran, to authorize a letter of no objection to the serving of beer at the River Cities Triathlon to be held at Cypress Park on August 6, 2006. Motion carried unanimously.

Jurors were provided a legislative report from the Police Jury Association containing information from the recent legislative session.

Mr. Altimus reported on his attendance at a dedication ceremony for the new tennis courts at North Bossier Park.

Mr. Altimus advised of a request from the City of Shreveport and Shreveport Green for a contribution of \$8,000 to assist in the annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection event to be held at the state fairgrounds on September 16. He stated that it is estimated that the event will cost \$60,000, and is funded by contributions from local governments and private donors.

Mr. Rogers suggested that a similar event be considered for Bossier Parish, stating that this would better serve the citizens of Bossier. Mr. Altimus is to review the matter.

Mr. Altimus advised of a letter of appreciation from the Town of Plain Dealing for the jury's assistance in animal control and for providing funding for the new kiddie park in Plain Dealing.

Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, presented Plan Change No. 4 on the new Benton Library project in an additional amount of \$2,030.81, and recommended approval. **Motion was made by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Cochran, to approve Plan Change No. 4 on the new Benton Library construction project in an additional amount of \$2,030.81, and to authorize the President to execute the change order. Motion carried unanimously.**

BE IT RESOLVED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury in regular and legal session on this 5th day of July, 2006, that Jerome Darby, President, be and is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Bossier Parish Police Jury, Plan Change No. 4 on the new Benton Library Construction Project.

The resolution was offered by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Cochran. Upon unanimous vote, it was duly adopted on this 5th day of July, 2006.

Mr. Ford discussed the Island Park Subdivision, advising that the development is located in both Caddo and Bossier Parishes. He stated Caddo Parish has submitted ratification documents verifying the police jury's approval of the plats of Island Park Subdivision, Island Park Town Homes, Unit No. 1, and Island Park Garden Homes, Units 1 and 2. Mr. Ford stated that his signature is required on the documents. **Motion was made by Mr. Cummings, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to authorize Mr. Ford to execute all documents in connection with the ratification of the police jury's approval on February 1, 2006, of the plats of Island Park Subdivision, Island Park Town Homes, Unit No. 1, and Island Park Garden Homes, Units 1 and 2. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Bruce Easterly reported that proposals from several major engineering firms have been received for the north/south corridor project. He stated that the selection will narrowed to five and a final selection made from the top five firms.

Mr. Trey Hicks and Mr. David Pattridge addressed the jury regarding road construction in North Point Estates located off the Linton Cut-Off Road. Mr. Pattridge stated that he operates a post-tension street construction business and requested that he be allowed to install this type of street in North Point Estates. He stated that the engineer of record for the development has approved the proposal and this is the only street in the subdivision. Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that the police jury could require a four-year maintenance bond on the street.

Mr. Pattridge explained the post-tension method, advising that less concrete is used in the process which reduces the roadway cost. **Motion was made by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Avery, to allow post-tension street construction on the one street in North Point Estates, with the stipulation that if this street is accepted into the parish road system, a four-year maintenance bond must be provided. Motion carried unanimously.**

Motion was made by Mr. Johnston, seconded by Mr. Williams, to approve the application of Linda Gilliard for a 2006 liquor license at Ark-La-Tex Nexus, 7007 Highway 3, Benton, LA. Motion carried unanimously. The application has been approved by the Sheriff's Department and the health department.

Ms. Martin reported that the audit of the 2005 police jury financial records is complete and copies will be available at the next meeting.

Ms. Martin reminded Mr. Rogers and Mr. Mitchell, that a temporary precinct polling place is needed for the East 80 Library, advising that the library will not be available for use for the September election due to construction.

Mr. Cathcart, Public Works Director, advised of the request of Mr. Cliff Cannon, highway department employee, for 10 additional sick days due to an automobile accident in which his children were injured. **Motion was made by Mr. Altimus, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to approve 10 additional sick days in 2006 for Mr. Cliff Cannon, employee of the Bossier Parish Highway Department. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Cathcart reported that the new paint machine has arrived. He requested authority to advertise for bids for the construction of a new storage building at the highway department. **Motion was made by Mr. Johnston, seconded by Mr. Altimus, to authorize the advertising for bids for construction of a new storage building at the highway department, bids to be received August 2, 2006. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Johnston advised of a request for repairs to Eighty Acres Drive, which is a private road. **Motion was made by Mr. Johnston to consider repairs to this road. Motion failed for lack of a second.**

Mr. Rogers advised of problems with dogs in the playground area of Tall Timbers Park. He requested that an ordinance be adopted to prohibit dogs from the playground area on the west side of the parking lot at the park, and that signage be placed at the park to advise the public. **Motion was made by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Mitchell, to adopt an ordinance prohibiting dogs in the playground area on the west side of the parking lot at Tall Timbers Park. Motion carried unanimously.**

ORDINANCE NO. 4109

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14 OF THE BOSSIER PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING SEC. 14-49 WHICH PROHIBITS DOGS WITHIN THE PLAYGROUND AREA OF THE TALL TIMBERS PARK, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury on this 5th day of July, 2006, that Chapter 14 of the Bossier Parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to add Sec. 14-49, as follows:
Sec. 14-49.

No dog shall be allowed in the playground area (on the west side of the parking lot) of the Tall Timbers Park located on Highway 80 in Bossier Parish.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any person who permits a dog owned by him or under his control or custody to run or remain at large within the playground area of Tall Timbers Park in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, within the discretion of the court.

The ordinance was offered by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Mitchell. Upon unanimous vote, it was duly adopted in this 5th day of July, 2006.
