MINUTES
August 20, 2008
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The Bossier Parish Police Jury met in regular and legal session on the 20th day of August, 2008, at 2:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Bossier Parish Courthouse, Benton, Louisiana. The President, Mr. Jimmy Cochran, called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Mr. Wayne Hammack and the pledge of allegiance was led by Mr. Barry Butler. The Secretary-Treasurer, Ms. Cheryl Martin, called the roll, with the following members present:

Others present were Mr. Joe E. "Butch" Ford, Jr., Parish Engineer; Ms. Cheryl Martin, Secretary-Treasurer.

Motion was made by Mr. Hammack, seconded by Mr. Benton, to adopt the minutes of the July 2, 2008, and July 17, 2008 regular meetings, as published. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Glenn Horton, Bossier Parish Sheriff's Department, requested a Quietus on the 2007 tax roll. The following recap for the period July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008, was presented for consideration:

99.7% of the 2007 adjusted Tax Roll was collected.

Motion was made by Mr. Hammack, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to grant a Quietus on the 2007 Tax Roll. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Kevin McCotter, Chesapeake Energy Corporation, stated that the company was founded in 1989 and now has over 7,000 employees. He stated that Chesapeake Energy Corporation was recently named by Fortune Magazine as one of the 100 best companies to work for in the nation. Mr. McCotter discussed the Haynesville Shale and provided a video presentation on natural gas production. He discussed Chesapeake's plans for proposed drilling in the area of the Haynesville Shale in the near future. Mr. McCotter stated that additional pipelines will be built to accommodate production from the Haynesville Shale.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to amend the agenda to add Mr. Paul Holmes. Motion carried unanimously. Mr. Holmes stated that he owns a 20.3 acre tract in south Bossier and wants to sell 4.7 acres and maintain the remainder of the tract. He stated that he provided a plat to the engineering department but has not had a response. Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that he will meet with Mr. Holmes as soon as possible to review this matter. He stated that administrative approval may be possible since it appears this is a minor plat only.

Motion was made by Ms. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Benton, to award the bid for the in-place cement stabilized base course and asphaltic concrete wearing course of approximately 1.322 miles of the Old Brownlee Road and Vanceville Road to Benton & Brown, LLC, low bidder meeting specifications, in accordance with bids received on August 6, 2008. Motion carried unanimously. Bid results are as follows: (see action below)

At Mr. Ford's request, **motion was made by Ms. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to rescind action awarding the bid for the in-place cement stabilized base course and asphaltic concrete wearing course of approximately 1.322 miles of the Old Brownlee Road and Vanceville Road to Benton & Brown, LLC. Motion carried unanimously.** Mr. Ford stated that the low bid for this project exceeds the estimated amount and asked that it be tabled until September 3, 2008. He stated that bids on additional overlay projects will be accepted on September 3, 2008,

and he will review all bid amounts at that time. **Motion was made by Ms. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Benton, to table the awarding of the bid for the in-place cement stabilized base course and asphaltic concrete wearing course of approximately 1.322 miles of the Old Brownlee Road and Vanceville Road, to be considered at the September 3, 2008 regular meeting. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, discussed bids received for the asphaltic concrete wearing course of approximately 2.085 miles of the Wafer Road, advising that the low bid on this project exceeds the estimated amount by approximately \$72,000. He stated that the additional funds are available to proceed with the project, and advised that Wafer Road is included in the 2008 Road Overlay Program. Mr. Ford stated that the additional cost for the project is due largely to the increase in asphalt costs. **Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to accept the low bid of Best Yet Builders, LLC, in the amount of \$305,737.91, for the overlay of approximately 2.085 miles of the Wafer Road, in accordance with bids received on August 6, 2008. Motion carried unanimously.** Bid results are as follows:

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to consider the adoption of changes regarding the new FEMA flood maps for Bossier Parish. Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, stated that in accordance with FEMA guidelines, the proposed changes must be adopted by September 26, and advised that he has forwarded the proposed ordinance to FEMA for their review. He then asked for comments from the audience. There were no public comments. A copy of the proposed ordinance was provided to Ms. Laura Adley.

Mr. Ford requested that the final ordinance be adopted at the September 3, 2008 regular meeting, subject to review by the parish attorney and by FEMA. The jury concurred.

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Forest Hills Subdivision, Unit No. 9, located in Section 14, Township 18 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, LA. Mr. Ed Kennon, developer, was present. He stated that utilities will be located at the rear of the lots. There being no opposition,

motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Forest Hills Subdivision, Unit No. 9, as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Martin announced the public hearing to adopt the property tax millage rate for the year 2008 for Bossier Parish Fire District No. 6. **Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to adopt an ordinance levying the 2008 property tax millage rate for Bossier Parish Fire District No. 6. Motion carried unanimously.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury of the Parish of Bossier, State of Louisiana, acting as the Board of Commissioners for Bossier Parish Fire District 6, in a public hearing held on August 20, 2008, and conducted in accordance with the open meetings law, that the following millage rate be and hereby is levied upon the dollar assessed valuation of all property subject to ad valorem taxation within said Bossier Parish Fire District No. 6 for the year 2008 for the purpose of raising revenue:

Jurors were provided current photographs for review of the condition of property at 607 Lawrence Drive. **Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Hammack, to schedule a condemnation hearing on September 3, 2008, to consider condemnation of property at 607 Lawrence Drive, in accordance with Bossier Parish property standards regulations. Motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Benton referred to the condition of property at 125 Bodcau Station Road, advising that the property has been cleaned up and is in compliance with property standards regulations. He requested that no further action be taken.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Cummings, to send a letter of appreciation to the owner of property at 125 Bodcau Station Road for their efforts in bringing the property into compliance with property standards regulations. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Bennett stated that the owner of property at 716 Simpson Street, Benton, LA, has requested a list of items which need to be addressed at this location, and requested that Mr. Andrews provide this to the owner. **Motion was made by Ms. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to allow the owner of property at 716 Simpson Street, Benton, LA, until September 17, 2008, to complete the clean-up of his property. Motion carried unanimously.** A review of the condition of this property will be held at the September 17, 2008 regular meeting.

Mr. Cochran, Chairman of the Juvenile Committee, stated that the meeting of the committee was delayed and will be rescheduled prior to the September 3, 2008 regular meeting.

Mr. Ford, Parish Engineer, reported that he met with the owner of property at 3411 Heatherbrook in Dogwood Subdivision regarding a drainage problem at this location. He stated that work is needed in the parish right-of-way, and stated that Highland Utilities has agreed to build a catch basin. Mr. Ford stated that this should resolve the drainage problems at this location, and advised that the property owner is in agreement.

Motion was made by Mr. Meachum, seconded by Ms. Bennett, to accept the proposal of Coyle Engineering Company in the amount of \$1,550 to provide right-of-way survey work for the Off-System Bridge Project, Crouch Road over White Oak Branch. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Ford stated that a portion of the proposed Crouch Road Bridge over White Oak Branch does not meet certain criteria of the Department of Transportation and Development and approval of a design exception in regard to the length of the vertical curve is requested. **Motion was made by Ms. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to adopt a resolution accepting the design exception, as requested. Motion carried unanimously.**

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury in regular and legal session on this 20th day of August, 2008, that it does hereby agree to the design exception of the length of the vertical curve at the Crouch Road Bridge over White Oak Branch, State Project No. 713-08-0109 on the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development Off-System Bridge Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, etc., that this exception is agreed to due to the fact that this is a rural road with less than 1,000 ADT and only one known accident has occurred there in the past 10 years. The bridge, for informational purposes, is being widened from 22 feet to 26 feet which will help this situation.

The resolution was offered by Ms. Bennett, seconded by Mr. Johnston. Upon unanimous vote, it was duly adopted on this 20th day of August, 2008.

Mr. Ford reported that a public hearing on the North-South Corridor Project will be held on August 26, 2008, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the police jury meeting room.

Mr. Ford advised of a Stakeholder meeting at the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development District 04 office on August 27, 2008, at 10:00 a.m., regarding Stage 0 on I-20.

A meeting of the Health and Sanitation Committee is scheduled at noon on September 3, 2008, to review the proposed drinking water protection ordinance.

Mr. Ford presented an update on the zoning study by Wilbur Smith Associates, advising that he will ask representatives of Wilbur Smith Associates to provide the jury with a report in September.

Mr. Ford reported on a meeting with officials with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development regarding local projects, advising that the parish is requested to prioritize its needs. He stated that there

was discussion of the condition of the Jimmie Davis Bridge, Highway 157 in Haughton and ramps at Bodcau Station Road.

Mr. Ford reported that Balar Associates is preparing documents for the taking of bids for the FY2008/FY2009 LCDBG Street Improvements Project.

Ms. Bennett asked the status of proposed street improvements in the Town of Benton. Mr. Andrews, Public Works Director, stated that parish work crews will provide the labor and equipment, and the Town of Benton will pay all material costs, as approved by the police jury on May 7, 2008.

Mr. Meachum asked the status of improvements to a small street at the Haughton Baptist Church. Mr. Ford reported that the cost for additional shoulder construction is approximately \$15,000.

Mr. Benton asked the status of the operation of the Property Standards Department during Mr. Gunter's absence. Mr. Ford stated that he has discussed this matter with Mr. Andrews, Public Works Director, and stated that a property standards employee is needed, as well as an additional employee to assist in animal control.

Mr. Butler advised of a request for acceptance of Gary Rex Circle. Mr. Ford stated that Gary Rex Circle is a paved road and advised that petition signed by all landowners on the road is required. Mr. Ford will review this matter.

There was brief discussion of mineral interests on right-of-way donated to the parish. Ms. Monica Grappe stated that in most instances, the landowner retains the mineral rights.

Mr. Ronnie Andrews, Public Works Director, presented an update on various road projects in the parish.

Mr. Johnston discussed the laying of a gas pipeline in the parish and asked if permits are required to cross parish roads. He stated that with the hauling of heavy equipment and pipe, there may be road damage.

Mr. Ford reported that he has been advised that several oil/gas wells are to be drilled in the Cycle Plant Road/Butler Hill Road area, and stated that a permit will be required for each location.

Ms. Bennett reported on the Smart Growth Summit held recently in Baton Rouge, advising that there was discussion of mass transit for rural areas, and of the importance of sidewalks in subdivisions.

Ms. Bennett commended Ms. Martin and the staff for the successful completion of the 2007 police jury audit, advising that there were no findings.

Mr. Johnston advised of a request from the homeowners association at Creekside Subdivision for assistance in developing a park in the subdivision. It was noted that this is private property and Mr. Benton stated that a park is planned at the Princeton Sports Complex.

Motion was made by Mr. Hammack, seconded by Mr. Plummer, that Mr. Hammack and Mr. Plummer will contribute \$1,000 each from discretionary funds to Parkway High School for team transportation expenses. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Meachum, to accept the remaining 25 feet of Cannon Road into the parish road system for permanent maintenance. Motion carried unanimously. Mr. Benton stated that this is a gravel portion of the road that is located just past where parish maintenance ends.

ORDINANCE NO. 4241

AN ORDINANCE PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 94, SECTION 94-7, OF THE BOSSIER PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES OF BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, ACCEPTING THE REMAINING 25' GRAVEL PORTION OF CANNON ROAD INTO THE PARISH ROAD MAINTENANCE SYSTEM FOR PERMANENT MAINTENANCE.

WHEREAS, the District 2 Representative has requested the inclusion pursuant to said ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Police Jury deemed it necessary to incorporate the remaining 25' gravel portion of Cannon Road as it is in desperate need of maintenance to provide safe access for emergency service vehicles, school buses, mail carriers, and the citizens of Bossier Parish.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that the Bossier Parish Police Jury, Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in due legal and regular session convened, that in accordance with Chapter 94, Section 94-7, of the Bossier Parish Code of Ordinances, the following road be and is hereby accepted into the Bossier Parish Road Maintenance System for permanent maintenance:

CANNON ROAD - Approximately 25 feet

Gravel portion at the end of Cannon Road located off the Wafer Road, Bossier Parish, LA.

Having met the requirements of Chapter 94, Section 94-7, Cannon Road is incorporated into the Parish Maintenance System.

The ordinance was offered by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Meachum. Upon the following vote, it was duly adopted on this 20th day of August, 2008.

Mr. Cochran advised of calls from concerned residents in his district regarding levee work being done by the Levee Board. He stated that residents are being asked to remove trees, structures, etc., from within six feet of the levee. Mr. Cochran is to review this matter with the Parish Attorney.
