MINUTES

The Bossier Parish Police Jury met in regular and legal session on the 20th day of October, 2010, at 2:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Bossier Parish Courthouse, Benton, Louisiana. The President, Ms. Wanda Bennett, called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Mr. Wayne Hammack and the pledge of allegiance was led by Mr. Jerome Darby. The Parish Secretary, Ms. Cindy Dodson, called the roll, with the following members present:

Others present were Mr. Bill Altimus, Parish Administrator; Mr. Patrick Jackson, Parish Attorney; Ms. Cindy Dodson, Parish Secretary.

Mr. Mark McElroy, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, provided an update on Lake Bistineau. He discussed proposed improvement projects, advising that an application is being submitted for Federal funds to increase boat access to Lake Bistineau during drawdowns. Mr. McElroy further stated that a lane-marking project is being considered which requires a 25% local match. He advised that funds of up to \$10,000 are also available for improvements to existing boat launches and stated that the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries funds 75% of these projects and a 25% match of cash and/or in-kind services is required. Mr. McElroy stated that the removal of trees in the lake is needed and requested that the parish provide assistance in cutting down trees at the parish boat launch, which will also help in the effort to control salvinia.

Mr. Altimus stated that Capital Outlay funds are available for modifications at the dam and advised that Bossier Parish will submit the application. Mr. McElroy recommended that the parish apply for funds for a skimmer at the spillway. Mr. Altimus stated that the estimated cost for the project is \$1.5 million and the Department of Transportation and Development has the design.

Mr. Hammack stated that concrete repair work is needed at the parish camp on Lake Bistineau, and recommended that the police jury apply for \$10,000 from the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to make the repairs. A proposal for concrete repairs at the parish camp is to be prepared for review at the November 3, 2010, regular meeting. A resolution supporting the application for funding will also be considered at that time.

Mr. Nguyen Kha, Assistant Parish Engineer, recommended that the low bid of David Lawler Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$144,441, be accepted for the Ivan Lake Dam Pipe Replacement Project No. 2010-281. **Motion was made by Mr. Johnston, seconded by Mr. Darby, to award the bid for the Ivan Lake Dam Pipe Replacement Project No. 2010-281, to David Lawler Construction, Inc., low bidder meeting bid specifications.**

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Bids were received on October 12, 2010, and results are as follows:

Ms. Dodson announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Wesco Estates, located in Section 18, Township 17 North, Range 11 West, Bossier Parish, LA.

Mr. Dan Atchley stated that the proposed three-lot commercial subdivision will have restrictive covenants, and that each purchaser is required to file a drainage plan, site plan, landscaping plan and erosion control plan. He stated that water will be provided by individual water wells with an aeration type sewerage treatment system. Mr. Kha stated that this area is located outside the jurisdiction of the Metropolitan Planning Commission and there are no zoning requirements. Mr. Benton recommended that the setback be increased from 50 feet to 75 feet off Sligo Road. Mr. Atchley agreed.

Mr. Cummings expressed concern regarding a pipeline that runs through Lot 1, and requested additional information on building regulations for Lot 1. Mr. Atchley stated that the pipeline is a distribution line from an existing well and advised that it is marked with visible signs. He stated that he is unable to provide building regulations at this time.

There being no opposition, **motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Plummer, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Wesco Estates, subject to the setback being increased from 50 feet to 75 feet off Sligo Road, and subject to legal review by the Parish Attorney of all matters relating to the pipeline located on Lot 1.**

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Ms. Dodson announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Cypress Bend Garden District, Unit No. 3, located in Section 20, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA.

Ms. Michan Holbrook, Coyle Engineering Co., Inc., stated that the proposed subdivision consists of 22 lots, and is a continuation of the existing subdivision. Mr. Kha stated that the proposal has been reviewed and meets all parish regulations.

There being no opposition, **motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Cypress Bend Garden District, Unit No. 3, as presented.**

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Ms. Dodson announced the public hearing to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Lakewood Subdivision, Unit No. 4-B, being a resubdivision of Lot 247, Lakewood Subdivision, Unit No. 4, located in Section 34, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA.

Mr. Ed Kennon advised that the owner of Lot 247 has requested to purchase a small strip of land that extends from the rear property line of Lot 247 to Green Lake.

There being no opposition, **motion was made by Mr. Butler, seconded by Mr. Avery, to approve the plat of the proposed development of Lakewood Subdivision, Unit No. 4-B, being a resubdivision of Lot 247, Lakewood Subdivision, Unit No. 4, as presented.**

The President called for public comment. Mr. Billy Golihar requested clarification of the request. Mr. Gordan Walter, owner of Lot 247, stated that he is purchasing the strip of land to prevent four-wheelers from riding in this area and to enlarge his backyard. It was further noted that the same subdivision covenants apply to this strip of property.

Votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Altimus, to schedule a public hearing on November 17, 2010, to consider the application of Wilcox Contracting, LLC, to the Bossier City-Parish MPC for a zoning amendment to change the zoning classification of a tract of land located south of the Red River Marina in Sections 8 and 9, Township 16 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, LA, from R-A, Residential-Agriculture District, to I-1, Light-Industry District, for an industrial park.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Johnston, to schedule a public hearing on November 3, 2010, to consider approval of the plat of the proposed development of Willow Trace, Unit No. 1, located in Section 36, Township 19 North, Range 13 West, Bossier Parish, LA.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Richard Gunter, Property Standards Officer, presented current photographs of property located at 235 Hedge Drive, Benton, LA, advising that not much work has been done.

Mr. Sam Turks, property owner, was present and advised that he is a disabled veteran. He stated that he has been working on clean-up of the property but needs additional time to complete the work. Mr. Turks stated that Mr. Gunter has advised him on what needs to be done and requested an additional 30 days in which to bring the property into compliance with property standards regulations.

Motion was made by Mr. Johnston, seconded by Mr. Avery, to allow the owner of property at 235 Hedge Drive, Benton, LA, an additional 30 days in which to bring the property into compliance with property standards regulations.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.** The matter will be reviewed at the December 1, 2010, regular meeting.

Ms. Dodson announced the hearing to consider condemnation of property at 1016 Little League Drive, Princeton, LA. Mr. Richard Gunter, Bossier Parish Property Standards Officer, advised that it is recommended by the Property Standards Board of Review that property located at 1016 Little League Drive, Princeton, LA, be condemned. He stated that there has been no cooperation from the mortgage company in cleaning up the property.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Darby, to proceed with the condemnation of property at 1016 Little League Drive, Princeton, LA, in accordance with property standards regulations.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Ms. Dodson announced the hearing to consider condemnation of property at 101 East Pointe Drive, Benton, LA. Mr. Richard Gunter, Bossier Parish Property Standards Officer, advised that it is recommended by the Property Standards Board of Review that property located at 101 East Pointe Drive, Benton, LA, be condemned. He stated that some work has been done, but advised that debris removed from the storage building has been left on the ground.

Motion was made by Mr. Avery, seconded by Mr. Altimus, to proceed with the condemnation of property at 101 East Pointe Drive, Benton, LA, in accordance with property standards regulations.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Ms. Dodson announced the hearing to consider condemnation of property at 3225 East Linton Road, Benton, LA. Mr. Richard Gunter, Bossier Parish Property Standards Officer, reported that it is recommended by the Property Standards Board of Review that the property be condemned, advising that debris has been left in the yard.

Motion was made by Mr. Hammack, seconded by Mr. Altimus, to proceed with the condemnation of property at 3225 East Linton Road, Benton, LA, in accordance with property standards regulations.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Richard Gunter, Property Standards Officer, reported that the Property Standards Board of Review has recommended that a condemnation hearing be scheduled to consider condemnation of property at 1250 Lars Road, Haughton, LA.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Hammack, to schedule a condemnation hearing on November 3, 2010, to consider condemnation of property at 1250 Lars Road, Haughton, LA, in accordance with property standards regulations.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Bruce Easterly presented Change Order No. 26 on the Cyber Innovation Center building, advising that this change results in an additional amount of \$470,848.18. He stated that the additional amount is within the project budget and recommended approval. **Motion was made by Mr. Hammack, seconded by Mr. Benton, to approve Change Order No. 26 on the Cyber Innovation Center building, and to authorize the Parish Administrator to execute documents.**

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**

Mr. Altimus advised that according to the police jury's Policy and Procedures Manual, a recognized holiday that falls on a Saturday is observed on the preceding Friday, and a recognized holiday that falls on a Sunday is observed on the following Monday. He stated that this year, Christmas Eve, which is an approved holiday, falls on Friday and Christmas Day falls on Saturday. Mr. Altimus recommended that Friday, December 24th, be observed for both the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day holiday.

Mr. Hammack stated that the police jury approved two paid holidays for its employees, Christmas Eve Day and Christmas Day, and recommended that Thursday, December 23rd and Friday, December 24th, be observed as Christmas holidays for 2010. He further recommended that the Policy and Procedures Manual be amended to address and clarify for future reference, the matter of days off for Christmas in the years that either of the Christmas holidays falls on the weekend. ORDINANCE NO. 4357

AN ORDINANCE TO OFFICIALLY POST CERTAIN BRIDGE STRUCTURES LOCATED ALONG THE PARISH TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM IN THE PARISH OF BOSSIER, STATE OF LOUISIANA.

WHEREAS, the Bossier Parish Police Jury is responsible for health, safety and welfare of the public utilizing the parish transportation system in Bossier Parish, and the bridge structures located on these transportation routes; and

WHEREAS, the Bossier Parish Police Jury, in order to provide advance information regarding the bridge structures located on its parish transportation routes, has structurally rated and posted certain bridges, as required by federal, state and local laws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury that the bridge structures listed below by structure number and location are hereby officially posted by signing to provide sufficient advance notice to the motoring public as to the load carrying capabilities of each structure:

RESOLUTION

ANNUAL CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE STATE OF LOUISIANA OFF-SYSTEM BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the code of Federal Regulation, as enacted by the United States Congress, mandates that all structures defined as bridges located on all public roads shall be inspected, rated for safe load capacity and posted in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards and that an inventory of these bridges be maintained by each State; and

WHEREAS, responsibility to inspect, rate and load post those bridges under the authority of Bossier Parish in accordance with those Standards is delegated by the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development to Bossier Parish.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the governing authority of Bossier Parish in regular meeting assembled does hereby certify to the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (herein referred to as DOTD) that for the period October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011:

1. The Parish has performed all interim inspections on all parish owned or maintained bridges in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards.

2. All bridges owned or maintained by the Parish have been structurally analyzed and rated by the parish as to the safe load capacity in accordance with AASHTO Manual for Maintenance Inspection of Bridges. The load posting information that has been determined by the Louisiana DOTD for all bridges where the maximum legal load under Louisiana state law exceeds the load permitted under the operating rating as determined above has been critically reviewed by the Parish. Load posting information has been updated by the Parish to reflect all structural changes, any obsolete structural ratings or any missing structural ratings.

3. All Parish owned or maintained bridges which require load posting or closing are load posted or closed in accordance with the table in the DOTD Engineering Directives and Standards Manual Directive No. 1.1.1.8. All DOTD supplied load posting information concerning a bridge has been critically reviewed by the Parish Engineer prior to load posting.

4. All bridges owned or maintained by the Parish are shown on the attached list in the format specified by the DOTD. Corrections to data supplied to the Parish by LA DOTD are noted.

These stipulations are prerequisites to participation by the Parish in the Off-System Bridge Replacement Program.

This resolution was considered section by section and as a whole. Upon motion by Mr. Avery, second by Mr. Cummings and vote, it was duly adopted on this 20th day of October, 2010.

ORDINANCE NO. 4358

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING INTENT TO ACQUIRE FULL OWNERSHIP INTEREST IN CERTAIN ADJUDICATED PROPERTIES

WHEREAS, the Police Jury of Bossier Parish previously adopted Ordinance No. 4304 of 2009, providing for the regulation of the acquisition of full ownership and merchantable title to adjudicated properties; and

WHEREAS, the properties identified on **Exhibit A** have been previously adjudicated to Bossier Parish and more than five years have elapsed from the filing of the tax sale certificate for each property; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of La. R.S. 47:2236 *et seq.* allow the Police Jury to declare, by Ordinance duly enacted, that it intends to acquire a full ownership interest in adjudicated properties.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, that:

Section 1: Claim of Ownership of Adjudicated Property.

A. The Police Jury of Bossier Parish, in regular session convened on the date set forth below, hereby declares it intends to acquire a full ownership interest in the properties identified on **Exhibit A** in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance and La. R.S. 47:2236 *et seq.*

B. A copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the recorder of mortgages for Bossier Parish. The recorder shall index the names of the tax debtor and the Parish of Bossier as mortgagees. A transfer, mortgage, lien, privilege, or other encumbrance filed after the filing of the Ordinance shall not affect the property. The recorder of mortgages or recorder of conveyances shall cancel, erase, terminate, or release the acts upon the request of the Parish Administrator.

C. The Parish Administrator shall, within thirty days after the filing of the instrument and Ordinance described above, or as soon thereafter as practical, send a written notice regarding the acquisition to the tax sale parties whose interest the Parish of Bossier intends to be terminated, that the party has until sixty (60) days after the date of the notice to redeem the property or otherwise challenge the acquisition in a court of competent jurisdiction.

D. The notice shall constitute a notice of sale. The sending of this notice shall constitute service of the notice of sale under Article VII, Section 25 of the Constitution of Louisiana. The notice required by this Ordinance shall be sufficient, and it shall not be necessary to determine whether notice of the tax sale or any other notice was given. The notice shall be sufficient if it conforms with La. R.S. 47:2236(C)(2).

E. The Parish Administrator shall cause to be published in the official journal of the Parish of Bossier a notice that any tax sale party whose interest the Police Jury intends to be terminated has until sixty (60) days to redeem the property or otherwise challenge the acquisition in a court of competent jurisdiction. The publication shall be sufficient if it is in the form provided for by La. R.S. 47:2236(D)(2).

F. If the property is not redeemed within the time limit set forth in this Ordinance, the Ordinance shall become operative, and the Parish of Bossier shall acquire full ownership of the property, subject only to such rights as determined by a final judgment rendered in an action filed within the time limits set forth in this Ordinance. The Parish Administrator shall file a notice in the conveyance records indicating that the Parish of Bossier has acquired full ownership of the property in compliance with this Section. The notice shall be sufficient if it conforms with La. R.S. 47:2236(E).

G. Contemporaneously with or subsequent to the filing of the notice, the Parish Administrator may file with the recorder of mortgages an affidavit indicating how the tax sale parties whose interest the Police Jury intends to be terminated were identified, how the address of each tax sale party was obtained, how the written notice was sent, the results of sending the written notice, and the dates of publication. The affidavit may also contain a statement of the interest to which the Parish of Bossier takes subject. The recorder of mortgages shall index the affidavit only under the names of the Parish of Bossier and the tax debtor, as mortgagors. The affidavit shall be sufficient if it is in the form set forth in La. R.S. 47:2236(F).

H. The filing of the affidavit provided in this Ordinance with the recorder of mortgages of Bossier Parish shall operate as a cancellation, termination, release, or erasure of record of all statutory impositions of all political subdivisions then due and owing, of all governmental liens, and of all interests, liens, mortgages, privileges, and other encumbrances recorded against the property sold and listed in the affidavit.

Section 2. Sale of adjudicated properties owned by the Parish.

A. In the event the Parish of Bossier acquires full ownership of any or all of the adjudicated properties described in **Exhibit A** pursuant to the provisions of La. R.S. 47:2236 and Section 1 of this Ordinance, the Police Jury hereby authorizes the Parish Administrator to sell said acquired adjudicated property or properties at public auction as set forth in Ordinance No. 4304 of 2009.

B. The Parish Administrator may select any or all of the adjudicated properties acquired by the Parish as listed on **Exhibit A** for sale at public auction. The selection of these properties shall be in the sole discretion of the Parish Administrator and may be done in single parcels or in multiple lots.

Section 3. General

All Acts of Sale of adjudicated property shall contain provisions, acceptable in form and substance to the legal counsel for the Police Jury, which provide that all such sales shall be for cash and shall be without warranty of title and without any warranty of merchantability or fitness; shall be "as is, where is"; that it shall be the obligation of the purchaser to obtain title insurance, if it is desired; that all such sales shall be subject to such encumbrances, liens, mortgages, real charges or other burdens reflected in the public records; and that the Act of Sale for such adjudicated property shall contain a condition which shall require the purchaser of such property to improve/renovate/make use of the tract, to the satisfaction of Bossier Parish Police Jury, within 270 days of the passage of the Act of Sale and that, if the purchaser fails to timely comply with this provision, Bossier Parish Police Jury shall have the right to dissolve or cancel the sale.

Section 4. Severability

Should any part of this Ordinance be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remainder of the said Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effective date

This Ordinance shall become effective upon the signature of the President and Secretary-Treasurer of the Bossier Parish Police Jury.

The above and foregoing Ordinance was read in full in open and legal session convened, was on motion of Mr. Avery, and seconded by Mr. Plummer and adopted on the 20th day of October, 2010.

Mr. Altimus advised that early voting for the November 2, 2010, election is open.

Mr. Altimus reported on a joint public meeting with the Caddo Parish Commission on October 14, 2010, regarding the proposed noise ordinance. He stated that the information presented at this meeting is available on the parish website.

Mr. Altimus reported on a ribbon-cutting ceremony held today for the opening of the compressed natural gas service station located on Texas Street in Bossier City. He stated that five parish dump trucks have been converted and will be using natural gas.

Mr. Bruce Easterly presented photographs of sand and dirt work done by parish crews at the Cypress Park beach.

Mr. Easterly presented photographs of the Poole Road bridge replacement project, advising that crews should begin driving pilings today. He stated that the project should be complete by February, 2011.

Mr. Ronnie Andrews, Public Works Director, provided an update on current road projects. He presented photographs of the new milling machine and of the new building at the highway department. Mr. Andrews requested input from jurors for preparation of the 2013 Road Overlay Program.

Mr. Butler expressed concern regarding the decibel levels being considered in the proposed noise ordinance. He presented noise regulations and information from other cities in the United States and stated that the decibel levels being considered in the proposed ordinance may be too low. Mr. Butler recommended that an increase in the decibel levels be considered. Mr. Jackson stated that the table of decibel levels in the proposed ordinance applies only if unable to establish an ambient. Mr. Jackson will further review this matter.

Mr. Avery stated that there are several properties in violation of property standards regulations in Haymeadow Subdivision and requested that the parish grapple truck be provided to allow residents of the neighborhood to have a clean-up day. He recommended that a letter be sent to residents to advise them of the date. Mr. Avery is to discuss this further with Mr. Altimus.

Mr. Avery further recommended that SWEPCO be requested to remove debris from their utility lines in this area.

Mr. Cochran requested that "Share the Road" signs be placed on Swan Lake Road to help protect cyclists using the road. He advised that new legislation provides that bicyclists are to be provided safe road access. Mr. Easterly will review this request with representatives of the Department of Transportation and Development and submit a report at the November 3, 2010, regular meeting.

Mr. Easterly provided an update on the North Bossier shared use trail, advising that once the Department of Transportation and Development releases the plans, the parish can move forward with the project. He stated that there are four small right-of-way tracts which must be purchased.

Mr. Patrick Jackson, Parish Attorney, provided an update on the Arthur Ray Teague Parkway Extension and stated that the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries is awaiting one report on the archeological survey.

Mr. Jackson urged jurors to support Constitutional Amendment No. 2 on the November 2, 2010, ballot, which proposes to decrease the amount of taxes retained by the state on the severance of natural resources, other than sulphur, lignite, and timber, and to increase the maximum amount of such revenues which are remitted to the parish governing authority from where the severance occurs.

Mr. Jackson advised that Mr. Schuyler Marvin, District Attorney, is hosting a fundraiser event on Saturday, October 23, 2010.
