The Bossier Parish Police Jury met in regular and legal session on the 5th day of July, 2017, at 2:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Bossier Parish Courthouse, Benton, Louisiana. The President, Mr. Bob Brotherton, called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Mr. Jerome Darby, and the pledge of allegiance was led by Ms. Wanda Bennett. The Parish Secretary, Ms. Rachel Hauser, called the roll, with all members present, as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 4650

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF A USER FEE OF \$36.00 PER YEAR (MILL KEY #1026053) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COSTS OF ANY AND ALL EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION AND ALL EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE BOSSIER PARISH EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE DISTRICT, PARISH OF BOSSIER, STATE OF LOUISIANA, FOR THE YEAR 2017, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAW.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury, acting as the governing authority of the Bossier Parish Emergency Medical Service District, in regular and legal session on the 5th day of July, 2017, that in accordance with law, a user fee of \$36.00 per year for the year 2017, shall be assessed persons owning each residential or commercial structure either occupied or unoccupied, located wholly or partly within the boundaries of the said District, each residential or commercial structure being defined as each residential or commercial unit in a structure and each housing unit within a multiple structure, and a mobile home, as defined in R. S. 9:1149.s(3), for the purpose of paying the

costs of any and all emergency medical transportation and all emergency services incidental thereto, as authorized and approved at a special election held in said District on October 16, 1993.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the proper administrative officers of the Parish of Bossier, State of Louisiana, be and they are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to extend said user fee against assessment roll of said District for the year 2017, and to make the collection of the user fee imposed for and on behalf of said District, according to law, and that the user fee herein levied shall become a permanent lien and privilege on all property subject to said user fee as set forth by law, and the collection shall be enforceable in the manner provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 4651

AN ORDINANCE TO LEVY AN ACREAGE TAX (MILL KEY #1026043) OF EIGHT CENTS PER ACRE ON ALL FOREST LANDS AND CUT-OVER POTENTIAL FOREST LANDS, SITUATED IN BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, AND TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE ASSESSOR IN AND FOR BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, TO ASSESS AND EXTEND SAID TAX ON THE TAX ROLL, AND TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT TAX TO BE COLLECTED BY THE SHERIFF AND EX-OFFICIO TAX COLLECTOR IN AND FOR BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, AND AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF SAID FUNDS COLLECTED, ALL ACCORDING TO LAW.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of Bossier Parish in regular and legal session on the 5th day of July, 2017, that for the year 2017 there shall be levied on acreage a tax of eight cents per acre on all forest lands and cut-over potential forest lands situated in Bossier Parish, Louisiana.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that this acreage tax shall be assessed and extended on the tax roll of Bossier Parish, Louisiana, by the Parish Assessor in the same manner as the assessment and extension on the tax rolls of the other taxes.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that said acreage tax shall be collected by the Sheriff and Ex-Officio Tax Collector of Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in the same manner as other parish taxes and when so collected shall be remitted to the Department of the Government having jurisdiction over the practice of forestry for deposit into the State Forestry Fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that said acreage tax shall be collected and deposited all in accordance with the law.

He stated that Mr. Robert Berry, Mr. Pat Culverhouse, Mr. Bruce Easterly, Ms. Julie Gill, Mr. Sam Marsiglia and Mr. Gary Wyche were also present. Other jurors present were Mr. Brotherton, Mr. Darby, and Mr. Salzer.

Mr. Ford reported that the Road/Subdivision Regulations Committee discussed with Mr. Robert Berry, Cypress Black Bayou Recreation and Water Conservation District, issues concerning Water's Edge, Cypress, Subdivision. He stated that he will provide the jury with an update at a later date on this matter.

Mr. Ford stated that the committee discussed issues with RVs being set up next to homes as a second residence on tracts of land. He stated that there are several RVs currently on Jeremy Lane and the subdivision covenants prohibit RVs from being set up and used as a dwelling in the subdivision. He further stated that letters will be sent to the homeowners requesting that the RVs be removed immediately.

Mr. Ford reported that the committee discussed the East/West Corridor Project. He stated that meetings have been held with Northwest Louisiana Council of Government and it is anticipated that the project will be split into segments, and a project management plan is to be submitted for approval so that engineering and right-of-way can be done in segments in order to obtain federal funding through NLCOG. Mr. Ford provided additional information pertaining to this project.

Mr. Ford stated that the committee discussed a request from the Bossier Parish School Board for assistance with track work for several schools. He stated that the tracks will be reviewed and a cost estimate will be submitted to the police jury for their consideration.

Mr. Ford stated that the committee discussed Airline Drive. He stated that Airline Drive is approximately 13 years old, and he will be obtaining a cost estimate to micro-surface Airline Drive.

Motion was made by Mr. Plummer, seconded by Mr. Cochran, to ratify and accept the recommendation of the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Unit Board of Appeals on June 21 21, 2017, to uphold the findings of the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Unit Officer, in the matter of G&G Manufactured Home Service, LLC, Report No. 1729, issued on April 4, 2017.

The President called for public comment. There being none, **votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.**
