June 2, 2021

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The Bossier Parish Police Jury met in regular and legal session on the 2nd day of June, 2021, at 2:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Bossier Parish Courthouse, Benton, Louisiana. The President, Mr. Jerome Darby, called the meeting to order. The invocation was given by Mr. Bob Brotherton, and the pledge of allegiance was led by Mr. Glenn Benton. Ms. Julie Gill, Secretary for the Parish Attorney, called the roll, with all members present as follows:

Mr. Ford stated that Project No. 2021-106, Winfield Road Improvements, was not publicly bid due to the estimated project amount being less than \$250,000.00. He stated that bids received on May 27, 2021, will not be acknowledged, and the project will be publicly bid. No action was taken.

Motion was made by Mr. Rimmer, seconded by Mr. Gray, to schedule a public hearing on July 21, 2021, to consider reducing the speed limit on Joe Lewis Road, located off Parker Road, in Section 12, Township 19 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, LA, from 25 miles per hour to 15 miles per hour.

The President called for public comment. There being none, votes were cast, and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Salzer, Chairman of the Capital Improvements/Building and Grounds Committee, reported on the meeting of that committee held today at 12:00 p.m. Committee members attending the Capital Improvements/Building and Grounds Committee were Mr. Salzer, Mr. Rodgers, Mr. Benton, and Mr. Marsiglia. Mr. Jackson (via phone), Mr. Jim Firth, Mr. Ford, Ms. Monica Grappe, Mr. Heath Lyles, Mr. Sam Marsiglia, Ms. Stacie Fernandez, Mr. Mark Coutee, Mr. Pat Culverhouse, Ms. Julie Gill, Ms. Hauser, and Mr. Altimus were also present. Other jurors present were Mr. Brotherton, Mr. Darby, Mr. Rimmer, Mr. Skaggs, and Mr. Jorden.

Mr. Salzer stated that the Capital Improvements/Building and Grounds Committee discussed renovations to the fourth floor which will house the Accounting Department and Human Resources for the Bossier Parish Police Jury, and Consolidated Waterworks/Sewerage District No. 1 of the Parish of Bossier.

Mr. Salzer stated that it is the recommendation of the Capital Improvements/Building and Grounds Committee to authorize an expenditure of funds in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 for Purtle and Associates to provide mechanical and electrical engineering services for improvements to the air quality for the Bossier Parish Courthouse and Bossier Parish Maximum Security Facility.

Motion was made by Mr. Salzer, seconded by Mr. Benton, to amend the agenda to accept the recommendation of the Capital Improvements/Building and Grounds Committee to authorize an expenditure of funds in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 for Purtle and Associates to provide mechanical and electrical engineering services for improvements to the air quality for the Bossier Parish Courthouse and Bossier Parish Maximum Security Facility, and to authorize execution of documents.

Mr. Benton, Chairman of the Road/Subdivision Regulations Committee, reported on the meeting of that committee held today at 12:30 p.m. Committee members attending the Road/Subdivision Regulations Committee meeting were Mr. Benton, Mr. Rodgers, Mr. Marsiglia, Mr. Brotherton, Mr. Jorden, and Mr. Rimmer. Ms. Stacie Fernandez, Mr. Mark Coutee, Ms. Hauser, Mr. Sam Marsiglia, Mr. Larry Landry, Mr. Pat Culverhouse, Mr. Ford, Mr. Altimus, Ms. Monica Grappe, Ms. Gill, Ms. Carlotta Askew-Brown, and Mr. Daniel Besinaiz were also present. Other jurors present were Mr. Salzer, Mr. Darby, and Mr. Skaggs.

Mr. Benton stated that the Road/Subdivision Regulations Committee discussed debris pick up by the parish. He stated that costs associated with debris pick up by the parish, which is approximately \$300,000.00 annually, is not a budgeted line item. He stated that after much consideration, it is recommended that the following items be approved as acceptable items for debris pick up by the Bossier Parish Police Jury Public Works Department.

All appliance doors must be secured by some means or removed to ensure that children cannot accidentally get inside the appliance.

Water heaters

Stoves

Refrigerators (free of freon and food)

Freezers (free of freon and food)

Ovens

Microwaves

Dishwashers

Washers

Dryers

Beverage coolers (free of freon and food)

Bar-B-Q grills (gas or electric)

Exercise equipment

OUTDOOR ITEMS:

Lawnmowers (riding or push)(free of all liquids)

Fencing (metal only)

Swing sets (metal only)(must be disassembled)

Trampolines (no canvas)(must be disassembled)

All items must be placed outside by the curb along side of roadway, but cannot be located close to the following items: Trees, signposts, telephone poles, mailboxes, concrete or brick driveway markers, anything that would be in the way of the grappler accessing the items.

In order to schedule an appointment for debris pick up, contact the Bossier Parish Police Jury Public Works Department at (318) 965-3752 between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Mr. Benton stated that citizens will need to contact their waste disposal service for all other items that are not included in the provided list of acceptable items for pick up.

Mr. Benton stated that Shreveport Green hosts several Household Hazardous Waste Collection days at the fairgrounds located off Greenwood Road in Shreveport in order to dispose of hazardous waste.

Mr. Rimmer stated that Goodwill will pick up couches and some furniture.

Mr. Darby stated that the costs for debris pick up has become very costly for the parish and highway department employees needed for road improvements and other projects throughout the parish are having to run the grappler truck for debris pick up.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Brotherton, to accept the recommendation of the Road/Subdivision Regulations Committee to approve the items as presented as acceptable items for debris pick up by the Bossier Parish Police Jury Public Works Department.

The President called for public comment. There being none, motion carried with the following votes cast:

Ms. Gill announced that the police jury intends to hold a public meeting in the Police Jury Meeting Room on Wednesday, July 21, 2021, to adopt an ordinance levying the 2021 ad valorem property tax millages.

Motion was made by Mr. Rimmer, seconded by Mr. Salzer, to approve rental renewal to Cyber Innovation Center and consider amendment to agreement with Cyber Innovation Center accordingly, and to authorize the execution of documents.

The President called for public comment. There being none, votes were cast, and the motion carried unanimously.

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Mr. Skaggs stated that Mr. Gene Sullivan, 116 Edwards Street, Benton, LA, was present at the May 19, 2021, police jury meeting requesting the police jury's assistance with prohibiting use of a driveway in Edwards Subdivision to access a tract of land that is not a lot in Edwards Subdivision and fronts Linton Road. He stated that Mr. Sullivan expressed concern of the increase in the amount of traffic using Edwards Street which has become a safety issue for the residents in Edwards Subdivision. He further stated that Mr. Sullivan is concerned that the property owner is illegally running a business from his home which is not zoned for a business.

Mr. Skaggs stated that he posed two questions for Mr. Jackson to answer regarding this matter. He stated that the two questions are as follows: 1) is the parish setting a precedence by potentially allowing access through a subdivision to a tract of land that is not part of the subdivision, and 2) has the Benton-Parish Metropolitan Planning Commission determined if a business is being conducted from the property at 297 Linton Road, Benton, LA, which is a residentially zoned tract of land and is not zoned for business use.

Mr. Roy "Gene" Hicks, III, 297 Linton Road, Benton, LA, stated that he visited the History Center at the Bossier Parish Library in Bossier City, LA, and found that on February 18, 1972, a map was recorded which shows that three phases for Edwards Subdivision was originally planned. He stated that the map provides that the first phase of Edwards Subdivision was to be located off Palmetto Road, and the second and third phases were to be located off Airline Drive.

Mr. Hicks stated that all lots that would have been the third phase of Edwards Subdivision was purchased by one man which prevented the third phase from being developed. He stated that the map provides that Edwards Street would have run from Palmetto Road to Linton Road, but was never constructed due to phase 3 never being developed.

Mr. Jackson stated that he has researched this matter based off the information provided to him from the May 19, 2021, regular meeting. He stated that his opinion, based off the information provided to him, is that there is no approved access off Edwards Street in Edwards Subdivision to Mr. Hicks' property, and there is no plat approved by this police jury that authorizes the driveway access in question. He further stated that in the past, the police jury has prevented access from a subdivision street to a tract of land not located within the subdivision.

Mr. Jackson stated that due to there being no approved access from Edwards Street in Edwards Subdivision to Mr. Hicks' property, the driveway access in question is a violation of the Bossier Parish Code of Ordinances.

Mr. Jackson stated that the opponent provided several photographs from 2018 through 2020, and Property Standards provided photographs from 2021 of Mr. Hicks' property. He stated that Mr. Hicks advised the police jury that work was being done on his property which is the reason work vehicles were on his property as opposed to running his business from that location. Mr. Jackson stated that permits were pulled in order to determine if there were any permits for work on Mr. Hicks' home during the date of the photos showing work trucks on Mr. Hick's property, but the permits do not match the activities on the property. He stated that he is not contesting that work was being done on Mr. Hicks' property, but there are no permits pulled for work being done on the property during the dates the photographs were taken.

Mr. Jackson stated that based on all the information provided, there is commercial activity on Mr. Hicks' property which is not zoned for commercial use, and that instead of work being done on the property, Mr. Hicks is storing equipment on the property which is a reoccurring issue with Mr. Hicks.

Mr. Hicks stated that he rents a lot on Linton Road where he stores his equipment and leases property in Shreveport for his business. He stated that on occasion he does bring his equipment to his home to do work on his property.

Mr. Skaggs stated that his concern is a precedence being set with accessing a tract of land through a subdivision. He requested that Mr. Hicks produce the proposed plat that shows three (3) phases of Edwards Subdivision.

He stated that in the past, the police jury has denied allowing access to property through a subdivision that is not part of the existing subdivision.

Mr. Skaggs recommended that the police jury authorize Mr. Jackson to pursue legal action prohibiting Mr. Hicks from using Edwards Street in Edwards Subdivision to access his property located at 297 Linton Road, Benton, LA, until such time as Mr. Hicks can produce documents that can be held up in a court of law which legally authorizes access from Edwards Street to Mr. Hicks' property.

Mr. Hicks stated that the driveway from Edwards Street was an existing driveway when he purchased the property located at 297 Linton Road, Benton, LA, and has been an existing driveway for approximately 38 years. He stated that he will forward to Mr. Jackson all documentation he has obtained which proves that the original master plan for Edwards Subdivision contained three phases.

Mr. Skaggs requested that Mr. Hicks provide all documentation to Mr. Jackson on this matter by the end of the week.

There was additional discussion pertaining to Edwards Street and Edwards Subdivision.

Motion was made by Mr. Benton, seconded by Mr. Brotherton, to adopt a resolution supporting Alloy Piping Products, LLC, 1036 Jack Wells Blvd., Shreveport, Bossier Parish, LA, and allowing them to receive the local benefits of the Quality Jobs Program.

The President called for public comment. There being none, motion carried with the following votes recorded:

INDICATING THE INTENTION OF THE BOSSIER PARISH POLICE JURY, STATE OF LOUISIANA, TO BECOME A PARTICIPATING POLITICAL SUBDIVISION IN THE LOUISIANA LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENVIRONMENTAL FACILITIES AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (THE "AUTHORITY"); APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF A DIRECTOR TO REPRESENT THE BOSSIER PARISH POLICE JURY ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE AUTHORITY; AND OTHERWISE PROVIDING WITH RESPECT THERETO AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 10-D OF TITLE 33 OF THE LOUISIANA REVISED STATUTES OF 1950, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, Chapter 10-D of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, comprised of R.S. 33:4548.1 through 4548.16 is known as the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority Act (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act creates the Louisiana Local Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority (the "Authority") for the purpose of assisting political subdivisions, as defined in the Act, and other designated entities in acquiring, financing and constructing certain facilities, including environmental, public infrastructure, community and economic development purposes and to otherwise establish programs to aid in the financing of local government and economic development projects; and

WHEREAS, the Bossier Parish Police Jury, State of Louisiana, is eligible to become a participating political subdivision of the Authority in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4548.4 of the Act, the governing authority of the Bossier Parish Police Jury, State of Louisiana, desires to become a member of the Authority ("Member") and to approve the appointment of Mr. Philip Rodgers to serve as a Director of the Authority and ratify any action taken heretofore by and on behalf of the member.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing authority of the Bossier Parish Police Jury, State of Louisiana, acting in such capacity:

Section 1. Under the authority of Section 4548.4 of the Act, it is hereby declared to be the express intention of the Bossier Parish Police Jury, State of Louisiana, to become a participating political subdivision and member of the Authority.

Section 2. Pursuant to the Act, the appointment of Mr. Philip Rodgers to serve as a director of the Authority for a term of two (2) years from the date hereof is hereby approved.

Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately and a certified copy hereof shall be forwarded to the offices of the Authority.

Mr. Skaggs reported on an earlier meeting with Mr. Kent Rogers, Northwest Louisiana Council of Governments, wherein Mr. Rogers provided information on the types of projects handled by NLCOG. He stated that in his capacity as President and CEO of The Coordinating and Development Corporation, he and Mr. Rogers have been working on a project for the last two years.

Mr. Skaggs provided additional information on NLCOG. He stated that in his roll at the CDC, he assists several rural and local governments with federal dollars and state project grants.

Mr. Skaggs stated that in other parts of the country, NLCOG and The CDC, along with state planning districts, are one organization which gives continuity of service to that region and allows resources to be pulled for more federal and state funds on different projects, and allows for more matching funds.

Mr. Skaggs stated that he and Mr. Rogers have been working for the last two years on how to combine NLCOG and The CDC into one organization. He stated that federal approval has been received authorizing the two entities to merge through a Memorandum of Understanding and for work to begin towards a plan of attrition.

Mr. Skaggs stated that Mr. Rogers will be President of this organization, and he will serve as CEO. He stated that currently it is necessary for the police jury to be a member of NLOG, but it has not been necessary for the police jury to be a member of The CDC. He stated that the merger of these two organizations creates a conflict of interest due to his position with The CDC and being a police juror.

Mr. Skaggs stated that due to the conflict of interest, he is resigning as Police Juror, District 5, with today being his last meeting and June 13, 2021, being his official last day.

Mr. Skaggs stated that it has been an honor to serve as Police Juror, District 5, for the last 10 years. He expressed appreciation to all jurors and staff for all they have done for him and their support. He stated that he has been a part of many teams in his life, but the best team he has ever had the opportunity to be a part of has been with the Bossier Parish Police Jury.
