

ORDINANCE NO. 5019

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 3295 OF NOVEMBER 30, 1993, WHICH ESTABLISHES A SPEED LIMIT OF 30 MILES PER HOUR FOR ALL VEHICLES TRAVELING UPON MAYFLOWER ROAD, BOSSIER PARISH, LA, BY REDUCING THE SPEED LIMIT FOR ALL COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES TRAVELING UPON MAYFLOWER ROAD, BOSSIER PARISH, LOUISIANA, AND PROVIDING THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Bossier Parish Police Jury in regular and legal session convened on this 19<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2024, that from and after the effective date of this ordinance, the speed limit for vehicles traveling upon Mayflower Road located in Sections 15 and 22, Township 17 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, Louisiana, is hereby established and set as follows:

**PERSONAL VEHICLES – 30 miles per hour**

From and after the effective date of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive a personal vehicle upon Mayflower Road located in Sections 15 and 22, Township 17 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in excess of thirty (30) miles per hour.

**COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES – 25 miles per hour**

From and after the effective date of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive a commercial motor vehicle upon Mayflower Road located in Sections 15 and 22, Township 17 North, Range 12 West, Bossier Parish, Louisiana, in excess of twenty-five (25) miles per hour.

Commercial motor vehicle is any motor vehicle used in commerce to transport passengers or property when the vehicle or vehicle combination has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating, or gross vehicle weight or gross combination weight, of twenty thousand one pounds (20,001 lbs.) or more.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall be fined a sum not to exceed One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00), or imprisoned for no more than thirty (30) days, or both.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

The ordinance was offered by Mr. Sutton, seconded by Mr. Darby. Upon unanimous vote, it was duly adopted on this 19<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2024.
